Head Teacher Update

Dear Families.

Despite the freezing temperatures this week it has been good to get back into the swing of school and back to the routine.

There have been lots of news stories regarding school attendance and we are in the beginning of a big nationwide campaign by the government to ensure that children are attending school. Whatever way you look at this issue, there is no substitute for regular attendance in schools and the research and data supports this with only 40% of children who were persistently absent last year achieving the expected standard at the end of Year 6. Beyond that, we know regular school attendance supports children's friendship and socialisation which has a positive impact on mental health and wellbeing. I am sharing again a link to the NHS website that helps parents to make decisions around illness and whether you should send a child to school.

Learning letters have been sent out for all classes now, detailing the plans for the forthcoming term and any essential information you need to know. As always, teachers are here to support you, so please get in touch either by email or in person, if you have any questions or queries and we can help!

Next week we are going all high-tech in the office and we will have a new online system for signing visitors as well as children who are late or leaving early in and out. It should be quick and efficient to use but don't feel overwhelmed - there is always someone on hand in the office to help you. If you do have to sign your child in as they arrive after registration has closed or you need to collect them in the day and sign them out, we will direct you to the white iPad at the office window.
