Head Teacher Update

Dear Families.

The Spring Term is a time when we open our doors to new prospective nursery parents and give families an opportunity to come and hear about all our good work and see the nursery in action. With each year that passes since opening the nursery class we are accepting more September applications which means we have less options available to those parents who are looking for a place mid-year. We have tours booked in to the diary, so if you are looking for a nursery place for September, now is the time to book on to a tour and apply. The closing date for applications is Friday 22nd March. Please pass this information on to anyone you know who may be interested.

Is your child struggling to manage their feelings? Are you unsure how to help them through their anxiety, anger or sadness? Join us on Thursday 21st March at 2.15pm to learn strategies and practical tools using The Zones of Regulation framework that we use in school. This session will define self-regulation and coregulation and highlight the basics of using The Zones in your home. Please let the office know if you would like to attend.

Next week is your opportunity to meet with class teachers, to discuss your child's progress against the end of year expectations for each year group as we reach the half way stage of the school year. This will be a time to discuss how your child can be supported to make progress and achieve their best. If you have not signed up yet for a slot please do so via the school office. The front door will be open from the end of the day until 5pm on Wednesday so please ensure your children are supervised at Parent Consultations. They should not be left in the school or the playground without an adult taking responsibility for them.

Universal Credit and childcare

You may be able to claim back up to 85% of your childcare costs if you're eligible for Universal Credit.

You (and your partner if you live with them) will usually need to either:

- be working it does not matter how many hours you or your partner work
- have a job offer

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How much you'll get

The most you can get back each month is:

- £950.92 for one child
- £1,630.15 for 2 or more children

You can claim Universal Credit online here.

If you stop working

If you stop working you must report a change of circumstances in your Universal Credit account.

It is Safer Internet Day on **Tuesday 6th February** and all the children will be reminded about how to keep themselves safe online. This is an important topic that we revisit every term with all classes and it is a topic that children are never too young to start having a conversation about. We wouldn't start talking and teaching a child about road safety and how to cross the road until they were old enough to do it by themselves and the same needs to happen with online safety.
