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Additional information needed for children claiming 15 hours free childcare

The Government has currently indicated you may be eligible for 15 hours of funded childcare a week - this is often called 'free hours', if you are in work or if you're in a couple you both need to be working.

You can usually get 15 hours of funded childcare if both the following apply:

- your child is 2 years old or will turn 2 years old before 1 April 2024
- you earn at least £8,670 a year and less than £100,000 a year adjusted net income, which is your income after some tax reliefs and deductions

If you're a couple, you'll both need to earn between these amounts. If you already get 15 funded hours of childcare from the government you can't get these hours as well. You can get the 15 hours of funded childcare at the same time as using Tax-Free Childcare or Universal Credit for childcare. To check eligibility, visit https://www.gov.uk/check-eligible-free-childcare-if-youre-working.

Additional information needed for children claiming 30 hours free childcare

The Government has currently indicated eligible families are those where both parents are working, or the sole parent is working in a lone parent family, and each is earning on average a weekly minimum wage equivalent to 16 hours at National Minimum or Living wage, (i.e. equating to about £6,000 per annum) and less than £100,000 per year. All children who receive the extended free entitlement provision at Shalford Infant & Nursery School for 30 hours per week are allocated a core offer of 15 hours which will be reverted to in the event of a child's eligibility for this entitlement ending. At this point in time parents will either have the option to directly fund the additional 15 hours per week themselves (refer to the Terms and Conditions document) or reduce their child's nursery provision to the core offer of 15 hours. **Note**: Core offer session days will be discussed and agreed at the time any change needs to be made.

All places will be allocated in accordance with Nursery Admissions policy. Note: Preferences cannot be guaranteed as sessions are allocated subject to availability which may result in your child being offered a place at either one of the session options outlined.

FEE – Free Early Education – universal entitlement of 15 hours per week for all two to four year olds. FEET – Free Early Education for Two Year Olds – offer of 15 hours per week for eligible two year olds. Extended Entitlement /30 hours – offer of an additional 15 hours per week (in addition to the universal offer of 15 hours per week) for eligible three and four year olds.
